The first step involves cleansing the body of the deceased and dressing it in fresh attire. The corpse is then laid on a wooden platform, covered with flowers, and brought by family and friends that would engage in prayer and chanting of selected mantras. Fire acts as a medium during the whole ceremony since the Hindus believe this cleanses the soul. Cremation is performed, with the ashes either disposed of in a holy river or retained in an urn.



Role of Priest and Family

The ceremony is headed by a Hindu priest, chanting the mantras and offering rituals for the departure of the soul. The funeral pyre is lit by the oldest son or the closest male relative of the deceased. This may happen at a crematorium in *modern Hindu Funeral Wandsworth services*. Members of the family end the ceremony by praying for the deceased soul and offering rice balls, water, and ghee.
